Nordic Trail use is free with a required Day Ticket available at the Hummingbird Lodge.

TRAIL SAFETY & ETIQUETTE

- Check posted trail conditions.
- Obey all CLOSED signs.
- Please keep walking, showshoeing, biking, and dogs off of Nordic tracks. Help keep nature pristine and clean up after your pet, keep them on leash and in control.
- Yield to downhill traffic.
- Stay in control.
- Be alert for signs of hypothermia, frostbite, or fatigue.
- Remember it takes longer to climb uphill than to come downhill.
- Notify staff of any trail hazards you may encounter.



RESPONSIBILITY CODE

As with any outdoor activity, an element of risk exists. Regardless of how you decide to use the slopes, always show courtesy to others. Please adhere to the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience. When using multi-use trails, please ensure to follow all directional signage.



Know the Code - Be Safety Conscious

This sign means you are entering an open avalanche area inside the ski area

It is your responsibility to understand and obey these avalanche area and ski area boundary signs shown below




The above sign means that you are leaving the ski area boundary and there is no avalanche control or first aid



This sign indicates the area is temporarily closed while avalanche control is underway or while an avalanche hazard exists. Disobeying this sign will result in suspension of skinn/ridina privilenes



Nordic Ski & Multi-use Trails



- MEADOW TRAIL | 1 km | Easiest flat loop between the Nordic Kiosk and the Whitewater Day Lodge.
- CAT'S PAW | 1.5 km | Starts easy, then drops across White Queen Mountain with ups and downs.
- **POLKA DOT TRAIL | 1 km |** Moderate to steep drops below the Nordic Kiosk.
- HAUL BACK | 1.3 km | Wide open cruising.
- **REINER'S RUN | 0.8 km |** Broad descent to the bottom of Evening Ridge.
- **BRANCH TRAIL** | **0.5 km** | Steep connection between Cat's Paw and Polka Dot Trail.

Nordic Trails are subject to closures during high avalanche hazard. Please check the snow report board at the Hummingbird Lodge.
